Background



India is a world leader in milk production and consumption since 1998 and likely to be the "Dairy to the World" in near future. At present, India produces 24% of the total world milk production amounting to 230 million tonnes showing 5% increase over last year. Out of the total milk produced, only 25-30% is handled by organized sector and hence there is a tremendous scope for the dairy industry to grow and serve the nation by providing safe and secure milk and milk products. Milk is considered as nearly complete food, as it has all most all the nutrients required by the body. Milk and milk products play very important role in human nutrition since centuries. They are also known to confer several health benefits apart from prevention of several diseases. Indian Dairy sector has unique small holder model, where almost 80-90% of the milk is produced by farmer holding 2-5 animals. This activity is a source of livelihood for more than 80 million rural households. The sector is an important job provider, especially for women, and plays a leading role in women's empowerment. Valued at almost Rs. 10 lakh crores, milk is the largest agricultural crop of India.

The Maharashtra Animal & Fishery Sciences University (MAFSU) was established under the State Act No. 1998 (MAH.XVII of 1998) on 3rd December, 2000 with its headquarter at Nagpur a tiger capital of India and orange city. The University has been carved out of the four Agricultural Universities in the state by transferring five Veterinary Colleges, one Post Graduate Institute of Veterinary & Animal Sciences and one Dairy Technology College. University made a commendable progress in developing the Fishery Faculty and strengthening Dairy Technology Faculty by establishing two new Fishery Colleges at Nagpur & Udgir and one Dairy Technology College at Udgir. Besides ten colleges in three faculties, Directorate of Instructions, Directorate of Research and Directorate of Extension Education, the University has a well-developed Directorate of Students Welfare, University Library, Bio-informatics Centre and training and placement centres. In the silver jubilee year of MAFSU, it is decided to organise a yearlong campaign on milk awareness and its nutritional benefits for consumers from 1st June 2024. On this world milk day MAFSU, Nagpur has organised more than 100 programs through its constituent colleges, KVKs and lower education schools. These two days conference is also a part of this celebration.

In 1992, College of Dairy Technology, Warud (Pusad) was established under the jurisdiction of Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh Krishi Vidyapeeth, Akola, with an initial intake capacity of 32 students. In December, 2000, it was transferred to MAFSU, Nagpur. College is offering the degree of B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) and M. Tech. in four disciplines i.e. Dairy Technology, Dairy Chemistry, Dairy Microbiology and Dairy Engineering. It has wellfurnished classrooms, laboratories equipped with modern instruments and students' training dairy plant.
