Background

India is a world leader in milk production and consumption since 1998 and likely to be Dairy to the world in near future. At present, India produces about 24% of the total world milk production amounting to 239.3 million tonnes showing about 5% increase over last year. Out of the total milk produced, only 25-30% is handled by organized sector and hence there is a tremendous scope for the dairy industry to grow and serve the nation by providing safe and secure milk and milk products to the consumers. **Indian Dairy Association** is working to help various stakeholders connected to dairy for overall promotion of dairy sector.

About Goa

Goa State Cooperative Milk Producers' Union "Goa Dairy" was established in the year 1984. A member owned Federal Body of 178 Rural Dairy Cooperative Societies spread all over the State of Goa, having 19,100 farmer families as their members procuring presently on an average about 65,000 liters of milk per day. A Co-operative Institution, having modern Dairy Plant of 1,10,000 liters per day capacity, supplying 95,000 liters of milk per day to the urban/semi urban consumers through 440 Milk Booths and 850 full time Distribution Agencies. Goa Dairy also has a modern Cattle Feed Plant, manufacturing around 12,500 M. T. of High Protein, Bypass Cattle Feed, Calf Ration & Pregnancy Ration per annum to cater to the nutritional requirements of milch animals of this State. Despite the efforts of the Goa Dairy , the amount of milk procured locally is a fraction of what is consumed daily for various reasons like a declining interest among the local youth in dairy farming, fragmented land holdings, and a lack of cooperative farming initiatives. This forces the state to import the vast majority of its dairy supply from neighbouring states, particularly Karnataka and Maharashtra from brands like Nandini and Amul.

About IDA

Established in 1948, Indian Dairy Association (IDA) is the apex body of the dairy industry in India. The members are from the cooperatives, MNCs, corporate bodies, private institutions, educational institutions, government and public sector units. 
